Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by Ms. Parker at 11:04am.

Roll Call: Attendance was taken by Dr. Cihak.

Approval of Minutes: A motion was made by Ms. Melnyk, seconded by Mr. Maresh, to approve the minutes from January 29, 2025. The minutes were approved by unanimous consent.

Public Comment None.

Presentation by the Dance and Musical Theatre Departments: Dr. Cihak introduced the students and staff that came to the Regional Board meeting to share their GSA experience. Senior Kyla Carrington shared about her experience teaching dance to students at Teens With A Purpose, while Lillian Langer and Peyton Whitehurst described the process of choreographing their senior capstone together and having it selected for performance at the National High School Dance Festival. Grace Santo performed a piece from Sister Act. Following the performance, Grace shared the impact GSA has had on her and highlighted her trip to Japan to connect cultures through the arts.

Closed Session: Ms. Melnyk made a motion to enter closed session pursuant to Va. Code § 2.2-3711(A), for the purpose of discussing the personnel report and a personnel matter, which was seconded by Col. Paulson. The Board entered into closed session at 11:25am. At 11:33am the closed session ended after a motion from Ms. Jenkins, seconded by Mr. Maresh. A motion was made by Ms. Melnyk to approve the personnel report, which was seconded by Mr. Maresh. The personnel report was approved unanimously.

Reports

Financial Report

- a. Revenue: Referring to the March 18, 2025 revenue report, Dr. Cihak noted that tuition is reflected from all but two localities. The payment from Norfolk Public Schools has been received but has yet to be posted to the account, while Southampton's Finance Office has confirmed they are processing payment.
- b. Operational Budget Expenditures: Dr. Cihak shared that the March 18, 2025 expenditure report is in line with where it should be this time of year and reflects the allocations of the additional state entitlement funds approved at the January 29, 2025 meeting. Dr. Cihak highlighted that the state entitlement overage has been used for hourly wages and supplies. The orchestra students will be receiving 60 iPads and foot-pedals paid for by the equipment grant.
- c. The financial report was accepted by unanimous consent.

School Report

- 1. Third Quarter Review: A very busy third quarter featured numerous performances and enriching experiences. GSA had the most amazing experience working with young composer Alma Deutscher, as our Vocal Music Department, accompanied by our Instrumental Music Department's orchestra, performed her opera, *Cinderella*. Alma was in residence at GSA for two weeks and conducted the orchestra for the performances. In addition to the cross-discipline performance for the school and invited guests, the performance for the general public was sold out at the Sandler Center. This project would not have been possible without our partnership with the Virginia Arts Festival. The Visual Arts Department held the 11TH Annual Wearable Art Fashion Show at the Chrysler Museum---it was an incredible event with the works of visual artists on the runway, accompanied by the tunes of the GSA jazz musicians. The entire school got to attend a version of the fashion show yesterday, during the cross-discipline event featuring the Visual Arts Department. Artist Joyce Scott, whose exhibit was one source of inspiration for the students' creations, attended the show, which drew a crowd of over 550 people.
- 2. **Fourth Quarter Preview:** Dr. Cihak shared that numerous events are planned for the fourth quarter including the Opera Scenes at University Theatre, Spring Dance and Orchestra Concerts, Spring Jazz Concert, Piano Recital, Chamber Music, the 37TH Annual Spring Juried Art Exhibition, the Theatre & Film Department's production of *Almost Maine*, and the Annual Student Film Festival at the NARO Expanded Cinema. The Musical Theatre Department will

- have a coproduction of *Footloose* with Virginia Musical Theater. Additionally, senior capstone events include the Senior Vocal Recital and Musical Theatre Senior Cabaret, along with 27 Senior Art Shows and 22 Senior Recitals. Dr. Cihak shared that fourth year Dance senior, Grace Malenda, has received over \$1 million in scholarships. Jazz student, Jack Parker has been offered a full-ride to Berklee.
- 3. **Alumni Update:** Dr. Cihak shared updates on several alumni including that Adrienne Warren has returned to Broadway in *The Last Five Years*, which the Theatre & Film students will see on their trip to New York. Ryan Speedo Green is in *Moby Dick* at the Metropolitan Opera; Marquise Hitchcock was on *Watch What Happens Live* on BRAVO; and Courtney Connor, a film student who graduated in 2024, has been selected to travel to Morocco for an intensive two-week film project with the VCU Cinema Department.

Foundation Report

Ms. Thorpe shared that there was nothing new to report.

Unfinished Business: None.

New Business

- 1. 2025-2026 International Trips: Dr. Cihak presented two international trips for consideration. Theatre and Film requests travel to London over spring break to attend workshops and perform. Visual Arts requests to travel to Venice in the summer for a glass intensive that will be almost 100% funded by artist Marcantonio Brandolini D'Adda. A motion to approve the trips was made by Ms. Melnyk, seconded by Col. Paulson, and approved by unanimous consent.
- 2. **FY26 Budget Public Hearing:** Dr. Cihak requested the FY26 Budget Public Hearing be set for May 28, 2025 at 11am prior to the next meeting of the Regional Board. A motion was made by Col. Paulson, seconded by Ms. Melnyk, and approved by unanimous consent.

Items by Board Members

Ms. Parker announced that Franklin will move to a pre-Labor Day start.

Adjournment

A motion was made by Ms. Melnyk, seconded by Mr. Maresh, to adjourn the meeting. The meeting was adjourned at 10:50 a.m.

Proposed Disbursement of the FY25 Bonus Payments

The Governor's School for the Arts

The Governor's School for the Arts was recently notified by the VDOE Director of Budget, Ed Lanza, that "Chapter 725, 2025 Acts of Assembly, authorized \$134.4 million from the general fund in fiscal year (FY) 2025 to school divisions, Academic Year Governor's Schools, and Regional Alternative Education Programs for bonus payments to instructional and support personnel. The state payment to school divisions is based on the cost of a \$1,000 bonus payment to SOQ-funded instructional and support personnel. The state payment to Academic Year Governor's Schools and Regional Alternative Education Programs is based on the cost of a \$1,000 bonus payment for staff reported to the Virginia Department of Education (VDOE) on the most recent collection of the Annual School Report (FY 2023 at the time of calculation). VDOE is required to make the payments to school divisions and eligible regional programs no later than June 1, 2025. School divisions have the authority to amend the bonus paid per employee to maximize the use of the state funds to promote retention among instructional and support positions. A local match is not required to receive these funds."

GSA proposes to follow the actions of fiscal agent, Norfolk Public Schools, to provide a \$1,000 retention bonus payment to the full-time staff (and part-time staff who work over 25 hours each week) and a \$175 bonus to the 75 part-time faculty members who taught all four quarters of the 2024-2025 school year and who return for the 2025-2026 school year.

GSA will receive \$31,219 in funding and respectfully requests approval to allocate the additional funds as follows:
